## Which Way Do You Look?

There are an amazing number of ways in which we look, although usually only one way at a time. Probably each way of looking has its own special merits.

When we were children, we were taught that we should always look both left and right before crossing a street. Now that we are adults, here are a few more examples of ways in which we can, and sometimes should, take a look. We can look high, and we can also look low. We can look up something, and we can also look through it. We can look into something, and we can also look away from it. We can look ahead, and we can also look back.

Thanks to a handout from a study at The Commons led by Rev. Susan Southall, this column looks back with wide view of the four Gospels on a single issue. Where can we look for evidence of God's resurrection power? Here it is:

1. In Matthew--the Resurrection is found when we choose to live it, practice it, and follow God until we fully believe it.

2. In Mark--the evidence for the Resurrection is found in the way God has worked in your past, before you even realized it, and is working in your future, to make you more like Jesus.

3. In Luke--resurrection is found in remembrance, choosing to believe in God's grace instead of shame and guilt from your past.

4. In John--resurrection is found in hearing God speak your name, and in realizing that God is always with you, despite all your uncertainties.

The season of Easter continues through May 29. So you have plenty of time to look around.
